

# ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL STABILIZATION FUND

Monthly Executive Report as of August, 2017

# I. Market Value as of August, 2017

The market value of the Economic and Social Stabilization Fund (ESSF) totaled US\$14,769.50 million at the end of the month. The variation of the period was due to: (i) accrued interest of US\$14.55 million, (ii) capital gains on investments of US\$147.22 million and (iii) administrative, custody and others costs of US\$ 0.11 million.



## II. Return as of August, 2017

The return in US dollars was 1.11% in the month. This was due to the performance of Money Market and Sovereign Bonds, 1.17%, Sovereign Inflation Linked Bonds, 0.96%, and Equities, 0.43%. The returns of the Money Market and Sovereign Bonds' and Sovereign Inflation Linked Bonds' portfolios were explained mainly by the positive returns they had in local currency, and partially by the appreciation against the US dollar of the currencies in which these portfolios are invested. On the other hand, the Equities portfolio had a positive return both in local currency and in dollars. The monthly return of the fund in pesos was -2.46%. Year to date portfolio's return was 7.23% in US dollars and 1.39% in pesos. Finally, annualized return since inception was 2.78% in US dollars and 4.26% in pesos.

Returns for periods of more than one year are compound annualized rates while those for less than a year correspond to the change as seen in the stated period. With a view to meeting high standards of transparency and providing a better assessment of the gains or losses on investments, the Ministry of Finance discloses the fund's return in different time horizons and currencies. With respect to the horizon, it is important to note that, in keeping with the medium- and long-term investment policy, the return assessment should focus on that period, disregarding fluctuations that may occur monthly or quarterly. With regard to returns expressed in different currencies, the return in US dollars allows for an assessment which is more in line with the investment policy given that the fund's resources are wholly invested abroad and in foreign currency. The return in Chilean pesos is also disclosed. This return reflects changes in the peso-dollar exchange rate and, therefore, may experience greater fluctuations. Finally, as with any investment, returns obtained in the past do not guarantee future positive results.
