Monthly Executive Report as of July, 2018

I. Market Value as of July, 2018

The market value of the Economic and Social Stabilization Fund (ESSF) totaled US\$14,615.10 million at the end of the month. The variation of the period was due to: (i) accrued interest of US\$13.85 million, (ii) capital losses on investments of US\$35.44 million and (iii) administrative, custody and others costs of US\$0.21 million.



II. Return as of July, 2018

The return in US dollars was -0.15% in the month. This was due to the performance of Money Market and Sovereign Bonds, -0.44%, Sovereign Inflation Linked Bonds, -0.31%, and Equities, 3.04%. On one hand, the returns of the Money Market and Sovereign Bonds portfolios were explained by the negative performance in local currency. Also, the depreciation of the Yen against the dollar made a negative contribution to the performance. Furthermore, the Sovereign Inflation Linked Bonds portfolio had a negative performance also due to the negative return in local currency. On the other hand, the Equities portfolio had a positive return, mainly explained by the performance in local currency. The monthly return of the fund in pesos was -1.56%. The Year to Date return in dollars was -0.85% and 2.95% in pesos. Finally, annualized return since inception was 2.46% in US dollars and 4.00% in pesos.

Returns for periods of more than one year are compound annualized rates while those for less than a year correspond to the change as seen in the stated period. With a view to meeting high standards of transparency and providing a better assessment of the gains or losses on investments, the Ministry of Finance discloses the fund's return in different time horizons and currencies. With respect to the horizon, it is important to note that, in keeping with the medium- and long-term investment policy, the return assessment should focus on that period, disregarding fluctuations that may occur monthly or quarterly. With regard to returns expressed in different currencies, the return in US dollars allows for an assessment which is more in line with the investment policy given that the fund's resources are wholly invested abroad and in foreign currency. The return in Chilean pesos is also disclosed. This return reflects changes in the peso-dollar exchange rate and, therefore, may experience greater fluctuations. Finally, as with any investment, returns obtained in the past do not guarantee future positive results.
