### I. Market Value as of May, 2022


The market value of the Economic and Social Stabilization Fund (ESSF) totaled US\$ 7,805.42 million at the end of the month. The variation of the period was due to: (i) accrued interest of US\$ 3.92 million and (ii) capital gains on investments of US\$ 50.51 million.



### II. Return as of May, 2022

The net return in US dollars was 0.70% in the month. This is broken down into the returns of Money Market and Sovereign Bonds portfolio, 0.73% and Sovereign Inflation Linked Bonds, -0.09%. The fund's monthly return measured in pesos was -2.86%. Finally, the accumulated return for the year is -8.95% in dollars and -11.52% in pesos, while the annualized return since the beginning is 1.72% in dollars and 4.62% in pesos.

Returns for periods of more than one year are compound annualized rates while those for less than a year correspond to the change as seen in the stated period. With a view to meeting high standards of transparency and providing a better assessment of the gains or losses on investments, the Ministry of Finance discloses the fund's return in different time horizons and currencies. With respect to the horizon, it is important to note that, in keeping with the medium- and long-term investment policy, the return assessment should focus on that period, disregarding fluctuations that may occur monthly or quarterly. With regard to returns expressed in different currencies, the return in US dollars allows for an assessment which is more in line with the investment policy given that the fund's resources are wholly invested abroad and in foreign currency. The return in Chilean pesos is also disclosed. This return reflects changes in the peso-dollar exchange rate and, therefore, may experience greater fluctuations. Finally, as with any investment, returns obtained in the past do not guarantee future positive results.
