



<sup>2</sup> Returns for periods of more than one year are compound annualized rates while those for less than a year correspond to the change as seen in the stated period. To meet high standards of transparency and provide a better assessment of the gains or losses on investments, the Ministry of Finance discloses the fund's return in different time horizons and currencies. With respect to the time horizon, it is important to note that, in keeping with the medium-and long term investment policy, the return assessment should focus on that period, disregarding fluctuations that may occur monthly or quarterly. With regard to returns expressed in different currencies, the return in US dollars allows for an assessment which is more in line with the investment policy given that the fund's resources are wholly invested abroad and in foreign currencies. The return in Chilean pesos is also disclosed. This return reflects changes in the pesodollar exchange rate and, therefore, may experience greater fluctuations. Finally, as with any investment, returns obtained in the past do not guarantee future positive results.


#### Figure 4: Investment by asset class Figure 5: Investment by country (percent of total) (percent of total) 35.4% **United States** Sovereign and 46.8% Government 12.6% Japan **Related Bonds** 48.0% United Kingdom **11.0%** France 7.1% 16.9% **4.8%** Italy Inflation Indexed 4.5% Sov. Bonds Germany 17.0% **4.1%** Canada **2.9%** Spain 19.9% <u>2.8</u>% Netherlands **Corporate Bonds** Supranational **2.3%** 20.0% **Q1 2014** Australia 2.1% **Q1 2014** South Korea 1.1% Benchmark 16.4% Benchmark Equities Belgium 1.0% 15.0% Others 8.5%

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
#### Figure 6: Investments by currency

(percent of total)












Figure 11: Principal exposures to corporate bonds (millions of dollars)





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#### Figure 12: Duration







#### Figure 14: Allocation by economic sector



### **IV. Other Indicators**

An indicator commonly used for monitoring the market risk of the portfolio is the return volatility. In the first quarter of 2014, the standard deviation of returns of the PRF was  $4.76\%^3$ . The tracking error ex-post, an indicator used to measure the degree of how close the portfolio tracks the return of benchmark, was 73 basis points<sup>4</sup> at the quarter end.

### V. Securities Lending Income and Administration Cost

The cost associated with the management of the fund by those responsible for the investment<sup>5</sup> was US\$ 753,114 during the quarter, while expenses associated with the custody service<sup>6</sup> was US\$ 978,965 (see Table 6).

Meanwhile, the securities lending program generated revenues of US\$ 62,384 during the quarter.

The entities responsibles for investing portfolios of equities and corporate bond portfolios were selected in 2011.
